4- Drop off & Pick up

Lessons start at **10:30** and finish at **14:00** with a lunch break at 12:00 pm for $\frac{1}{2}$ hour. All pupils are expected to be at school no later than **10:25** and parents must escort their children to the entrance hall. Children will be escorted by their teacher (or volunteer) to their respective classrooms or to the assembly room (Level 1 classroom).

Please note the following and the times and locations for drop off and pick up:

- Drop off for all pupils, levels 1 to GCSE, at the main entrance hall.
- Pick up for Level 1 to 2 from their respective classroom fire exit doors (external doors)
- Pick up point for Level 3- GCSE outside the entrance door (courtyard).
- Entrance lobby is to be kept clear at all times and only used as a transit area.
- Parents other than permanent helpers (weekly volunteers) should not enter the building during drop off and pick up times.
- Parents other than permanent helpers (weekly volunteers) can only enter the building under prior arrangement with either the headteacher (Hicham Adjali) or the welfare support officer (Malika Ait Mimoun).

5- Fees

Kings College has increased the rental fee for this year, however, families contributions per term for this academic year 2025/2026 will remain £50 per child, 3rd child (with 2 registered siblings) remains free of charge.

9- Parents Meetings

Parents are required to attend a minimum of two 10-minute meeting sessions with their child teacher upon invite (**see dates in section 14 of this Newsletter**), please ensure you attend these to go through some essential information regarding the school and parents' expectation, homework, behaviour, contact details, your child progress monitoring, reward system, absence, etc.

Please ensure that your child attends school **every week** and does not miss any lessons as this has a big impact on their progress and attitude to learning throughout the year.

If for any exceptional reason this happens, please inform your **child's teacher** (Levelx@gaec.net), where x is the class level -e.g. 1, 2, etc.-, and catch up with their homework ready for the next session.

Note that any unjustified absence will result in a penalty towards the pupil weekly marking, refer to GAEC CODE OF CONDUCT for further details.

11- Equipment/ What to bring to school

Please ensure your child has the following items at **all** sessions:

- Textbook (Level 3 to Level 7). Available to purchase via the school.
- Exercise book (lined notebook which will be provided by the school)
- Reading Record book & School Reading book (provided by the school)- Levels 3 to 7 only.
- Pictionary, this is a personal Vocabulary book (provided by the school)- Levels 3 to GCSE
- Pencil case (inc. pen, pencil, coloured pencils, rubber and sharpener)- Level 2 to GCSE.
- Packed lunch & water bottle.
- Personal hand sanitiser (for older children who can use it without supervision)
- Suitable clothing (coat in cold weather, sunhat in summer and suitable shoes)

We strongly advise that children do not bring any valuables to school and that all their belongings are suitably labelled including their textbooks.

The use of **Mobile phones** during the lessons, at assembly and on the stairs is strictly forbidden.

12- Homework

All classes have a **weekly homework** which is normally due the following Saturday. Your help with this at home is essential.

If your child misses a lesson for exceptional reasons, make sure you get their homework from their teacher and get your child to complete it for the next session as this helps them catch up with their work.

Experience shows that the most successful pupils are those with committed parents who get involved with their children's learning on a regular basis.



13- Reading Support- Levels 3 to 7

Some of our level 3-7 pupils will benefit from our **One-to-One Reading Support** scheme at school. To be successful and fully beneficial to the children, this needs to be strongly supplemented by a **continuous and regular** support at home.

Please ensure you help your child with the recommended daily reading (minimum 5 minutes) and use the provided **Reading Record books** for the 2-way feedback.

14- Curriculum and GCSE Specification

Level 1 & 2 use GAEC own resources, no 3rd party textbooks are used.

Level 3 to 6 use mmbooks primary "Kitabi" books series.

Level 7 pupils work to the Edexcel GCSE Arabic (1-9) specification using the GCSE book "Your Arabic Friend edition 2017".
